## Headteachers update

#### Dear Families,

HAPPY NEW YEAR! I hope you have all had a brilliant holiday and have manged to spend some quality time with your incredible children. The beginning of term has been full of excitement and enthusiasm although, staff included, I think everyone is a little tired (3). The children have settled brilliantly including our new starters across the school. It has been lovely seeing you all again in the mornings and sharing a story or two, even though we could do with some slightly better weather.

Just before the Christmas we were delighted to be supporting Sebastian's Trust, a local charity close to our hearts. Your kind donations on Christmas Jumper Day raised an amazing **£322.65**. The festive period is never easy but your kindness has made a real difference to other families and children in the local community – thank you ③. On the theme of fundraising, our amazing year 5 cohort (entrepreneurs of the future), organised and ran their 'Owlprentice'. The children did an incredible job where they were even battling for customers in the hall. The children made an astonishing profit of **£689.84** over the day, more importantly the children showed true determination, kindness, inclusivity and respect, towards their end goal – we could not be prouder of them all – you'll read more about it later ⑤...

At Owlsmoor we are proud to be a UNICEF Rights Respecting School. Most recently the staff and children were assessed for our SILVER award. I am delighted to say that we passed with flying colours which means Owlsmoor is now a UNICEF UK SILVER: Rights Aware School and the only one in the local area. It is an incredible achievement for the team and I hope you will join me in congratulating everyone involved. Keep an eye out for our new certificate and banner which will be on display very soon.



Finally, I just wanted to remind you all about the school start times. The children are expected in the classroom for registration by **8:45am**. The ONLY exemption for this is nursery who need to be in class by 9:00am. We are still having children turning up very late to school which is impacting their learning. We are also having the opposite problem where

children, mainly years 5 and 6 are turning up to school just after 8am. Children should not be on the school site before 8:35am and it is not safe for them to be there on their own. If your child walks into school please encourage them to time their walks so they arrive closer to the desired time of 8:35am.

Thank you all so much for continued support, I know I always say it, but we can't do what we do without you. Take care, keep safe and be kind to one another.


Thank you once again for your unwavering support. We look forward to continuing this learning journey with your children.


