At Owlsmoor Primary School, we ensure all pupils, including those with additional needs, have access to a full and rich curriculum and high quality teaching and learning.

All teachers employ a range of teaching strategies including: multi- sensory approaches to teaching and learning, oracy activities, small group work, adult check ins and adult support, task planners, visual timetables and suitable positioning of children in classroom (this list is not exhaustive).

All staff work closely with external professionals to ensure that we provide high quality provision for any child with additional needs. Staff are trained according to the needs of pupils.

We provide resources and equipment to support each pupil's individual needs. For instance, if a pupil has Irlen's syndrome, they would be provided with coloured overlays for reading and coloured paper for writing.

We have a range of school clubs that are supportive of all pupil's needs. When planning school trips the needs of pupils with SEND are prioritised at the planning phase and reasonable adjustments are made to ensure all pupils are given the opportunity to develop their cultural capital.

We promote the emotional and social development of all pupils through quality teaching of a rich and diverse curriculum, which incorporates P.H.S.E and promotes well-being. We offer targeted nurture support from our Family Support Assistant and our two trained ELSAs (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) for those pupils who require it.

Pupils with medical conditions are fully supported so that they have full access to the curriculum, including school trips and physical education. All areas of the school are accessible.
