For anyone who would like to know how you could help with what is happening right now in the Ukraine - one way is to support local charities working in the Ukraine. There are several Ukrainian charities working on the ground who you may wish to donate to:

- <u>Sunflower of Peace</u> is a charity that helps paramedics and doctors, and has been fundraising for supplies, which includes first aid medical tactical backpacks.
- <u>United Help Ukraine</u> focuses on providing medical supplies and humanitarian aid, and raising awareness of the conflict.
- <u>Voices of Children</u> aims to help children affected by the war in eastern Ukraine, providing support through art therapy, psychologists, video storytelling and a number of other methods.
- The <u>British Red Cross</u> has launched an emergency appeal to help Ukraine. The charity will be updating its webpage with news on the work its team is doing, and how support will be used to help people.
