

Each child is expected to have the following items in school at all times:

- Water bottle- water only for the classroom please; squash or fruit drinks are permitted for lunch bags
- · Reading record and school reading scheme book

It would also be useful if the children could bring in:

 A <u>slim</u> pencil case with a glue stick (white only please), colouring pencils, felt tip pens etc.

All items should be able to fit into a desk tray and be clearly labelled.

Children should not bring precious objects or items into school in case they get lost or damaged.

Snacks and Packed Lunches

Children are welcome to bring in a snack for break time. Snacks should be fruit or vegetables only - this does not include items such as 'fruit winders' that contain a lot of sugar.

If children bring packed lunches to school, please do not include nuts as Owlsmoor Primary School is a 'nut free' school. This includes spreads, such as Nutella, that contain nuts.

Rewards

House points and tokens are awarded in recognition of effort, kindness, achievement, helpfulness etc. Children in the house with the most points at the end of the term will receive a treat.

All children who have read at least four times in a week, <u>and</u> had their reading records signed, will have extra playtime, usually on Wednesday afternoon.

Certificates for 'Star of the Week' will be handed out by the class teacher.

The children in Year 5 will choose a class treat at the end of each term if they fill their class marble jar - marbles are awarded for whole-class effort, achievement or excellent behaviour.

School Behaviour Policy

All classes follow the school behaviour policy:

- Step 1 Children receive an initial warning/reminder.
- Step 2 Children will be moved to the class 'Time out' table to reflect on their actions and to complete a 'Thinking about my Behaviour' sheet
- Step 3 Children will be sent to a parallel class to complete their work
- Step 4 Children will be sent to the phase leader/member of senior leadership team
- Teachers will communicate more serious/repeated issues with parents.



<u>Reading:</u> Children are expected to be heard reading aloud for at least 20 minutes every day and that <u>reading records are signed by an adult</u>, with comments where appropriate.

As children progress through the reading scheme, comprehension of the text and use of expression becomes more important, along with continued development of fluency.

To promote 'reading for pleasure', a list of recommended reading books has been sent home with the children and is also available on our website.

<u>Homework:</u> Will be sent home every <u>Thursday</u> and should be handed in by the following <u>Wednesday</u>. This will be a piece of maths homework and a piece of reading comprehension homework - children are expected to spend <u>up to</u> 30 minutes per piece. The White Rose calculation policy is available on our school website.

If homework is not completed, children will attend a homework club, supervised by a teacher, during a break or lunchtime the same week.

<u>Spellings</u>: Spellings will be sent home every <u>Thursday</u> and will be tested on the following <u>Wednesday</u>. We recommend that children practise their spellings each day.

The words to learn come directly from the National Curriculum - we start by recapping the Y3/Y4 curriculum words in the Autumn term, before moving on to the Y5/Y6 curriculum spellings.

<u>Times tables:</u> In addition to their weekly homework, it is expected that children continue to learn their times tables and the related division facts. <u>Fast recall</u> is a key focus as well as understanding the link to division.

There are apps (e.g. Hit the Button and Times Table Rock Stars), songs and videos on YouTube that can support your children in learning these. As a school, we have signed up to 'Times Table Rock Stars' and your child's login details have been sent home.

If your child is finding their homework too easy or too difficult, please let us know as we will be able to review the level of homework being set.

PE kits should be plain navy blue/black with a plain white T-shirt.

<u>Handwriting</u>: Children are expected to join up their handwriting using a cursive style. In Y5, they will be working towards attaining their pen licences if they have not already received one.


