Everything we do here is for our amazing children and I hope you can see the impact some of the changes are having. I can't thank you enough for all of your support, we cannot do what we do without you.


Year 4

In addition to the transition days at their secondary school, the children will be given the opportunity to discuss their thoughts and apprehensions during our PSHE lessons.

We are hoping to hold a Year 6-exclusive leavers event in the final week of term, and we will send more information about that when we have definite confirmation as to what this event will look like, and the exact date and timings.

As is tradition, Year 6 will also be holding the 10p Fair, on Wednesday 21st June, straight after school. The Year 6 pupils will run activities that the rest of the school can choose to take part in, to raise funds for Year 6 events and activities.
