Science News!

Eagle House Science Workshops

In June, two groups of Y6 children attended science workshops at Eagle House School. I was lucky enough to go along with them; we were all so impressed with the school and its fantastic science labs. The children used their scientific skills when mixing solids and liquids to cause chemical reactions. They were particularly impressed with the reaction that created a luminous blue glow; they learned it is the same reaction that causes glow sticks to work when we crack them! They also loved watching the teacher, Mrs Fisher, 'sacrifice' a Jelly Baby by heating it quickly in a test tube to release its sugar. When it was mixed with the liquid in the test tube, the results were astonishing – look closely at the final picture below and you will see the amount of smoke and fire pouring out of the test tube! It was an absolutely wonderful day and I cannot thank Mrs Fisher and Phil, the minibus driver, enough for making it all so special. The children were 'buzzing' with excitement on the way back to school 3.

So, that's it – my very last science update for the newsletter. It has been a 'blast' to lead science in the school for the last five years and to continually be told by the children that it is one of their favourite lessons.
