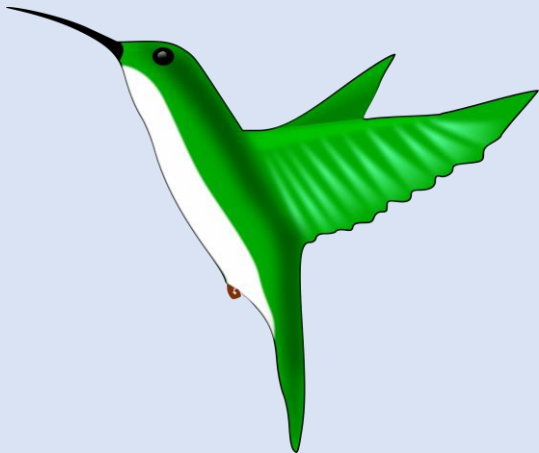

What should my child bring to school?

- Reading book and signed reading record
- Water bottle
- If your child brings in a pencil case, please ensure it is small enough to fit in their tray.
- Library slots:
 - Flamingos – Thursday
 - Toucans – Tuesday
 - Hummingbirds - Wednesday
- P.E. days for Year 4 are Mondays and Fridays. Your children should come to school wearing their P.E. kits on these days.

Elite Swimming

- Monday 11th November 2024 – on site 😊
- 2 weeks - Daily - 30 minute sessions.
- Children are assessed during first lesson and split into appropriate teaching groups.
- Children will change in an enclosed, heated gazebo.
- A letter will be sent home with more details closer to the time.



Swimming:

Rules from the Swim School:

- **Swimming hats/caps** must be worn by ALL swimmers and named on the outside with the child's first name in a waterproof pen please.
- A sensible costume should be worn, allowing free movement (we request that girls wear a one-piece swimming costume rather than a two piece).
- Goggles are not required, but if the children do prefer to use them, they must be named and the child must take responsibility for their safe-keeping;
- No jewellery should be worn in the pool (**including stud earrings**);

- Infectious foot diseases, e.g. athlete's foot, verrucas etc. should be covered with a swimming sock, available from the chemist;
- Pupils will need a named plastic bag to store wet swimming clothes; and a change of dry underwear.
- Swimming aids (e.g. armbands/ floats) **will be provided** for those who require them, so the children do not need to bring these themselves.
- Children may want sliders/flip-flops to wear whilst changing

Home Learning:



- 6/9 activities to be completed each half term
- The reading comprehension must be one of the 6 activities
- Early home learning can be handed in whenever it is completed
- Adult supervision is encouraged where required 😊

Spellings are taught weekly in class, but there will be no weekly spelling tests 😊

Reading:



- Children should read at home **at least** 4 times per week.
- Ideally they should read to an adult daily.
- Please record when they read in their reading record. It doesn't have to be lots of writing, children can write the book title in and you can just initial!
- You can find a list of recommended books for your child's age range on the school website.



Reading:



- Please ask your child questions about what they are reading –it is important they *understand* what they are reading.



Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)



- *“The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.” www.gov.uk*
- The check will take place in school June 2024.
- It is an online test therefore it will be completed on school iPads.
- We will do plenty of practice throughout the year.
- Please continue to use Times Tables Rockstar at home as often as possible.

Parent Helpers:



- We are always grateful for any parent (or even grandparent) helpers!
- This could be offering one-off help or on a regular basis.
- All parent helpers **must** be DBS checked.
 - DBS checking will be conducted by the school at no cost to the parent.
 - The school office can give you the details on how to apply.
- What might parent helpers do?
 - Help to supervise a trip.
 - Listen to the children read.
 - Help with specific projects in class (such as art or design and technology projects).

General reminders:



- Uniform:
 - Jewellery should not be worn, other than small studs or small hoop earrings.
 - Earrings and watches must be taken off for P.E. – if earrings can't be taken out, they will have to be covered by tape. The children must be able to do this by themselves.
- Unless we have received **written permission** from you, it is expected that your child will be collected from the classroom door at the end of school.
