Everyday Routines

Learning

Spellings – given out on Friday and tested on Friday.

PE



- * PE days are **Tuesday and Wednesday** for all children.
- * PE kit should be in school all week.
- * Correct kit must be worn and warmer clothes needed for the winter.
- * Girls must have socks to put on if they are wearing tights
- * No earrings to be worn for PE – must be taken out.
